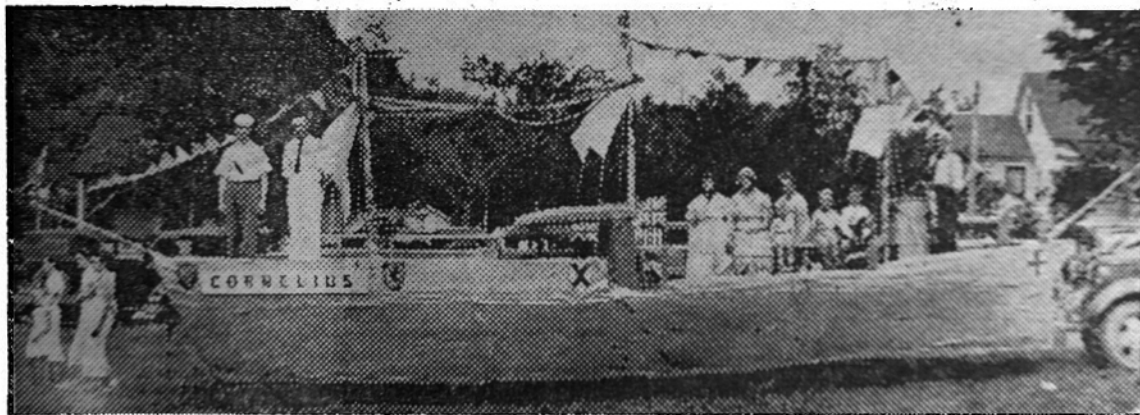


As Harvey District Honored Founders



ABOVE are shown the first and second prize winning floats in a parade of floats which featured Saturday's observance in a three-day celebration at Harvey Station, York County, of the district's centenary.

The one at top depicts the Cornelius, a boat in which the first settlers of Harvey voyaged to New Brunswick from the Old Country 100 years ago. The float itself was built by Kay Craig and Levi Wilson, both of Harvey, whose ancestors had come over on the original Cornelius. The float was awarded the first prize of \$10 in cash.

Below it is the Little Settlement district entry, which won the second prize of \$5. This float contrasts modern life at Little Settlement, whose first settler had the name of Little, with conditions as they existed years ago. On one side is shown a miniature log cabin, with an elderly couple in old-fashioned clothes seated on a bench, while on the other is a model frame house, with a younger couple reclining in comfortable modern chairs. The float itself was a community built entry.
